

## **2010-2011 Expanded Learning Program (ELP) Enrollment Process** *Frequently Asked Questions*

*How do I get an application?*

Enrollment applications are available in room 102 at Francisco Middle School.

*Where do I return the application?*

Applications can be returned to Josh's box in the Main Office or to Room 102.

*How do I know if I am in the program?*

ELP staff will contact the family to confirm enrollment into program. A returned application does not guarantee a spot in the program.

*What requirements are there to be in the after school program?*

ELP is open to all students at Francisco Middle School. Priority is given to referrals from teachers and administrators.

*How many students are in the program?*

There are only 140 after school spots. Once capacity is reached a waiting list will be started.

*When is the program open?*

ELP is open every day that the school is open. The program runs 3:25-6:25pm.

*What activities does ELP provide?*

3:25-3:40 students eat snack and sign into program and begin their first hour of homework. 3:30-4:30 students are working on their academics. 4:30-6pm students attend an enrichment or recreational club of their choice. Possible club options include but not limited to: gardening, bike riding/bike shop, art, music, media, cooking, baking, basketball, baseball, soccer, youth leadership and much more! The last 25 minutes of program the students have free time.

*How much does ELP cost?*

The program is free. Students receive a snack, space to do homework, enrichment and recreation activities.

*How often does my student need to attend?*

Students are highly encouraged to attend ELP every day until the end of program. Please talk to the ELP Site Manager, Josh Feierstein, to make other arrangements.
